4.2 Future site developments at RSPB South Stack

Cllr. Geoff McGinn met with representatives of the RSPB as per their request, the purpose of this meeting was to give advance warning of their intention to charge £5.00 parking all the year round in both RSPB car parks. Their proposals also included requesting double yellow lines all the way up the road to South Stack, they would also be charging for the spaces by the entrance to the light house path. Cllr McGinn tried his utmost to dissuade them but they were emphatic in their intentions. He was also informed of their intention to demolish the house and café and replace them with bigger and better facilities. It was agreed to write to the RSPB to voice concerns.

4.3 Developments at the top of Ravenspoint Road. Members had received a huge number of enquiries from concerned residents about the work carried out on the headland. The Planning Enforcement Officer from IOACC had visited the site and the matter was ongoing.

9.1 Councillor Bill Rowlands

Gave a full report on the 2nd 'Place Shaping Workshop he attended in Llangefni on Thursday 22nd February. The purpose of the workshop was to present ideas and assist Community Councils in identifying and addressing community needs, promoting public engagement and to encourage partnership working between Councils. Cllr Neville Evans from Bryngwran Community Council explained how the villagers had banded together to form a co-operative to run the lorweth Arms and develop it into a very successful community hub.

Cllr. Rowlands also announced that the Trearddur Bay Residents and Tennants Association were intending to hold a 'litter pick' on 24th March 2018 but in the meantime the Chairman of Trearddur Bay Junior Football had asked whether the residents association and Community Council would like to join them in a similar exercise on 18th March. He was keen to have the club integrating more within village community. It was agreed that it would be good to work together on this,

Cllr. Rowlands would circulate the request and confirm a final date.

9.2 Cllr. Dafydd Rhys Thomas

Announced his intention to put forward a motion to IOACC for a plastic free Anglesey. The aim was to encourage business to offer alternative packaging etc. and for everyone to reduce the use of disposable plastic packaging etc. Council Members agreed to support him in this quest.

15. PLANNING APPLICATIONS

15.1 46C35E/LB Ellin's Tower, South Stack , Holyhead

Listed Building Consent for replacement of external door – no objection.

15.2 46C402F/VAR Pendorlan, Trearddur Bay.

Application under 73A of the variation conditions (05) (existing site access), (06) (estate road and footpaths), (09) (drainage system) and (10) (retention of grassed area) of permission reference 46C402D (full application for the erection of 13 houses, closure of existing access to Pendorlan and improve access to Cliff Apartments) so as to allow pedestrian/cycle access from Lon Isallt, create access

to rear gardens of houses A1 to A4, phased completion of estate road and footpaths together with phased completion of drainage systems after works have commenced on site – no observations.

15.3 **46C392F Ty Calva, Ravenspoint Road, Trearddur Bay**

Full application for alterations and extensions together with the creation of a dormer window which includes a balcony – no objections.

15.4 **46C613/SCR Cae Erin, Lôn Garreg Fawr, Trearddur Bay.**

Screening opinion for the conversion of the existing Golf Club Dormy House into three self-contained holiday let apartments. Noted.

15.5 **46C613 Cae Erin, Lôn Garreg Fawr, Trearddur Bay.**

Full application for the conversion of the existing Golf Club Dormy House into three self-contained holiday let apartments - no objection.

15.6 46C88K/AD RSPB Visitors Centre, South Stack Road, Holyhead

Application for the siting of two non-illuminated together with the installation of two car parking meters – the Community Council was firmly of the view that to impose expensive parking charges on all visitors to the site will have a huge detrimental effect on the wellbeing of local residents, many of whom are retired or live on low incomes and visit the area to enjoy the views, visit the cafe, have fresh air and to exercise. It was also likely to have a serious impact on the number of visitors to South Stack and the café.

15.7 46C612A/AD Elin's Tower, South Stack, Holyhead

Application for the siting of a non-illuminated together with the installation of a car parking meter – the Community Council objected to this for the same reasons as those given in 15.6.

16. APPLICATION FOR APPEAL

APP/L6805/A/18/3192930 - The Old Cricket Ground

Noted: The Community Council were opposed to this application for a number of reasons including, Over development of the site, increased risk of flooding, the development would not meet local housing needs, inadequate infrastructure, traffic and parking issues, negative impact on the area etc. A full report was to be sent to the Planning Inspectorate.
